Abstract

The role and contribution of transportation is very important in strategic business. According to the Malaysian Government Transformation Programme, transportation is one of the national priority areas and plays a significant role in contributed much to the development and improvement of the economic, social, political and cultural conditions of the nation. It is also included as key focal points in the Eleventh Malaysia Plan for 2016 to 2020. Generally, the logistics industry forms the backbone to the supply chain in order to stimulate trade and facilitate business efficiency. In the past, managing the logistics industry has been a neglected area of business activity. Nowadays, the prospects for Malaysia's logistics industry are positive, but there is still need innovativeness in terms of services, process, marketing, and management for competitiveness. Most companies in selling or producing goods require facilitating agencies; such as third-party logistics (3PL) service providers to assist them in transporting their products and services from one destination to another until they reach the end customer. In general, third-party logistic (3PL) is more dominant in the industry compare to other types of logistics service providers such as 4PL is outsourced services generally corporate job and the exists of 5PL for advantage to manage networks of supply chains with an extensive e-business focus across all logistic operations, other than 3PLs and the parent company. In Malaysia there are 1,092 Third Party Logistics (3PL) Service Providers as listed in the Federation of Malaysian Freight Forwarders (FMFF) 2016 Directory.

Reformulation of Indonesia Human Rights Courts Competence in *Ius Constituendum* Context

Abstract

Since its birth man has had a basic right or commonly referred to as human rights, in its development the issue of human rights has become the attention of countries around the world including Indonesia, in the context of international real implementation in relation to the issue of human rights is the establishment of the International Criminal Court under the Rome Statute, where the International Criminal Court is authorized to prosecute gross violations of human rights including crimes against humanity, genocide crimes, war crimes, and aggression crimes, while in the context of Indonesian law enforcement against human rights marked with the establishment of Human Rights Court according to Law Number 26 Year 2000, which the Indonesian Human Rights Court has the authority to prosecute serious violations of human rights in the form of crimes of genocide and crimes against humanity, so if we compare the authority of the International Criminal Court with the human rights court in Indonesia there is a difference, The crime of aggression and war crimes is not regulated into the competence of human rights courts in Indonesia, for that matter shows that in Indonesian positive law especially Law Number 26 Year 2000 shows the existence of legal issues that is the legal void that is necessary to obtain an academic study as the purpose of this research.

Differences of Job Seeking Stress as Effects of Perfectionism and Perceived Parenting Style

Abstract

The purpose of this study was to investigate how undergraduate students feel job seeking stress as effects of perfectionism and perceived parenting style to help them effectively preparing to be the one of this society. The research questions were set up as follow: First, is there a differences in the undergraduate students' job seeking stress according to perceived parenting style? Second, is there a differences in the undergraduate students' job seeking stress according to perfectionism? To gain answers about these questions, a survey targeting the graduate students in Busan was made. 500 survey questionnaires were distributed, and 423 responses were collected. The data were analyzed by t-test. Results of this study were as follow. First, the group of lower care experienced higher job seeking stress, personality stress, family stress and expectation stress than the other. And, the group of higher protection experienced higher job seeking stress and all of sub-scale stress. Second, the group of higher self-oriented perfectionism students experienced more school stress than lower one. Other-oriented perfectionism students experienced more job seeking stress, personality stress and study stress. And social prescribed perfectionism group was suffer from all of sub-scale stress more. Second, the results of correlation modeling supported by the conclusion that other-oriented perfectionism and socially prescribed perfectionism are partial mediator in the relationship between father and mother's parenting style and job-seeking stress. As a result of this, when we work with a university student suffering from job-seeking stress, we need to consider about their parent and characteristics.

Revitalizing the Local Wisdom of 'Nosarara Nosabatutu' in Social Participation at Palu City

Abstract

Nosarara Nosabatutu is a concept of local wisdom of the Palu community about Unity and Brotherhood. This local wisdom can be used as a unifying media of Palu community that has been experiencing of various social conflicts. Therefore, this article is intended to describe the application of local wisdom Nosarara Nosabatutu in uniting the people of Palu and minimize the social conflict. In expressing this matter, it conducted a survey research on 2 sub-districts in Palu city that has been experiencing various social conflicts. The sub-district managed to unite its citizens by increasing their social participation in various social activities. At the same time, the increasing in social participation has had an impact on reducing social conflict among them. Respondents from 2 sub-districts were distributed questionnaires about the conflicts that had occurred in their area, the factors that caused the conflict to diminish, their belief in local wisdom. In addition, there is a key informant, the sub-district officials interviewed about government programs related to local wisdom in unifying Palu communities. The results show that local wisdom revitalization is done through (1) involving local custom institutions in various activities, (2) the sub-district government is directly involved in social activities, (3) multiplying activities that bring together and increase community participation, such as joint work, sport and art contest weekly, arisan of neighbourhood. These activities are the implementation of local wisdom 'Nosarara Nosabatutu' in realizing the unity and brotherhood of Palu society
