Effects of COVID-19 Pandemic on Micro, Small, and Medium-Sized Enterprises in the Province of Ilocos Norte Philippines

Abstract

The study investigates the effects of the pandemic brought about by Covid-19 on Ilocos businesses and establishments. The study participants were the owners of micro, small and medium businesses in Ilocos Norte, and they were selected using a convenience sampling technique. The study employed a quantitative research design, and the entrepreneurs were asked about the perceived impact of Covid-19. Using descriptive statistics, the findings divulged that the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on the businesses ranged from retrenchment of employees, disruption in the supply chain, and temporary to permanent shutdown. The impact of the pandemic includes uncertainties, the decline in productivity, demand, and sales. Implications, conclusions, and recommendations were also provided in the study.

Investment Project of Sekala the Common Place: Should Sekala Open Up a New Outlet?

Abstract

Coffee is one of the most consumed beverages in the world, coffee consumption in the world and Indonesia is growing rapidly year to year. Even in the pandemic, the demand for coffee is still high. This was the reason that there are so many new coffee shops, but some of them did not last long, the main reason was they are not preparing the calculation precisely. Sekala planning to open up a new outlet in Bandung, with the measurement projection using capital budgeting from the year 2022-2026. This was required to measure whether the project is feasible or not. The project will be considered feasible if it meets certain analysis that was provided by feasibility analysis, sensitivity analysis, and Monte Carlo simulation. Feasibility analysis is required to show whether the projection is feasible or not. Sensitivity analysis is used to measure some criteria that affect the most Sekala in terms of the financial side, later on, it will be used on Monte Carlo analysis to see the project feasibility based on several simulations. The initial investment for this project is IDR 242,177,275.60, and the result of this projection is, payback period of 1.22 years, an estimated NPV of IDR 513,913,208.73, benefit/cost ratio of 3.12, and an internal rate of return of 52.04%. The sensitivity analysis result shows that the 4 most influential criteria are affecting the business. Monte Carlo simulation results show that this project has a high chance probability of giving NPV andlt;0, for 40-55%.

Abstract

Intramuros, also known as the "Walled City" is one of the Philippines' pride and a top tourist spot in Manila. If marketed well, more people will go down memory lane and learn about this must-seen destination. One will venture into its culture and learn the history within the walls. To make use of this advantage, a platform is effective. Thus, social media impact is seen nowadays as an effective way to create an impact in the tourism industry. Sustainability Reporting Guideline for Small Medium Enterprises (SMEs): Case Study from 25 SMEs in Indonesia

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Abstract

The sustainability reporting trend has been increasing in Indonesia for the past few years, with the government's plan to make sustainability reporting mandatory for all companies, including Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs) that have significant impacts on national economics. So far, there are no specific guidelines for SME's sustainability report. There are many indicators in the global sustainability reporting guidelines that are not suitable for SMEs since they are limited in the resources and knowledge they can disseminate. Therefore, this study aims to develop a sustainable reporting guideline for SMEs. This study analyzes the sustainable development reporting practices of Indonesia and other countries through literature review, interviews and surveys, in order to build a sustainable development reporting guide for SMEs. The reporting guidelines recommended in this study contain 25 indicators: 12 general information indicators, 1 economic indicator, 6 environmental indicators, and 6 social indicators. Based on a survey of 25 small and medium-sized enterprises, this guideline is suitable for preparing SMEs' sustainability sustainability report

Homeroom Adviser's Role on School Family Involvement in Senior High School in Manila



Abstract

Teachers play an important role in bridging the gap between school and home. The success of pupils is defined by their relationship to the educational process. Parent participation can improve the conduct, participation, and accomplishment of pupils. School and community partnerships can also serve to enhance, support, and even transform learners and individual partners to increase the quality, resources efficiency and goal alignment of the program. In this case Republic Act No. 9155, school leaders should have authority, accountability, and responsibility in the school and community. The purpose of this descriptive study was to evaluate the roles of homeroom advisers in school-family involvement. The study polled 375 parents in grade 12 from a selected Senior High School in Manila's District VI. Its specific goal was to investigate the extent to which homeroom advisers play a role in school-family engagement as perceived by parent respondents for families to participate in school planning, leadership, and volunteering. The overall mean result of the evaluation on the degree to which homeroom advisers influence school-family engagement is involved. Among the indicators of respondent 's assessment on the extent of Homeroom Advisers' Role on school-family involvement, the highest is Information to families to assist their children's learning and the lowest indicator is Opportunities for families in school planning, leadership, and volunteer activities. There is a recommendation of the study that the homeroom adviser's manual should indicate the involvement of parents in school, planning, leadership and voluntary activities to improve their commitment to high-quality education.
