Integrative Holistic Early Childhood Education (HI ECE) in Indonesia Amidst the COVID 19 Pandemic

Abstract

Background - Integrative holistic services towards children in Indonesia has become a major priority in Early Childhood Education (ECE). However, the COVID 19 pandemic had hindered its implementation, especially in how the teachers ought to accommodate the services of health and nutrition, parenting, and protection. The shifting school delivery from direct teaching to virtual classrooms was not anticipated. In order to maintain and increase the teachers' competence in implementing integrative holistic services, around 60 teachers in Kendal Regency, Indonesia, had received six online workshops and seminars.

Purpose - The purpose of the research is to investigate the implementation of holistic integrative early childhood education by the teachers has been enhanced after receiving the online workshops and seminars, as well as to find its barriers during the pandemic.

Design/methodology/approach - The descriptive qualitative research was employed by having three online focus groups discussions (FGD) with 17 teachers from 17 different subdistricts. The additional individual interviews were also conducted. The secondary data was also collected from the literature the strengthen the findings.

Findings - The research found that the ability to the competence of ICT had the largest impact on online teaching practices, especially in encouraging parents' involvement in teaching and playing with the children at home. They also committed to building a safer school environment and evidence-based first aid treatment for children. The recent limited face-to-face learning also had enabled them to teach children's protection and disaster mitigation through songs and role-plays. However, the parenting and health programs could not be optimum due to the physical distancing policy.

Research limitations - *The finding could not be generalized to all teachers due to the data collection methods.*

Originality/value - The research suggested that the implementation of HI ECE amidst requires not only the collaboration between schools and health workers but also the participation of the communities and government institutions in promoting the rights of children.

Contextualized and Localized Guided Notes as Supplemental Material in Mathematics Learning

Abstract

Background - The Covid-19 pandemic spread worldwide, including in the Philippines, and changed the way people live, work, communicate and learn. In the academic year 2020-2021, the Department of Education is offering schools an alternative learning method that includes Modular Learning. The learners are using self-learning modules (SLMs) in printed or digital/electronic copy. These modules are given in a limited period and need to be brought back to school. Therefore, there is no notes that left to the students.

Purpose - This study aims to develop contextualized and localized guided notes as supplemental material in Mathematics learning and determine the students' perception of the developed material in terms of attitude towards the use of guided notes, usefulness, and effectiveness.

Design/methodology/approach - This study made use of a descriptive developmental research design. A descriptive research design was used to describe the respondents' perception of contextualized and localized guided notes as supplemental material. It will be done along with the developmental research design where the researchers used ADDIE Model to develop the material. To collect the data, the developed material was given to the students ahead of time with the students' self learning modules. At the end of the quarter, survey questionnaires were given to determine the students perception.

Findings - Findings of the study showed that the developed contextualized and localized guided notes in Mathematics is very acceptable with a weighted mean of 4.51 based on the following criteria: objectives, content, usefulness, and presentation as evaluated by the selective specialists. Furthermore, students had a highly positive attitude towards guided notes with a weighted mean of 4.54. The students perceived the developed material as very useful with a weighted mean of 4.52 and very effective with a weighted mean of 4.56 as supplemental material in Mathematics.

Research limitations - The developed material was for the Third Quarter of Mathematics 8 in Academic Year 2020-2021. Due to inadequate time, it was limited to the four topics in Mathematics 8: Mathematical System, Axiomatic Structure of Mathematical Systems, Illustrating Triangle Congruence and Illustrating the SAS, ASA, and SSS Congruence Postulate.

Originality/value - The developed guided notes in this study is contextualized and localized. It differs from other guided notes since it was created by the teacher itself and given by the students as their reviewer and notes. In addition, this developed material includes activities that the students can answer. The contextualized and localized guided notes can enhance the students' knowledge and can be use as a reference to refer back to if they have confusion in the past lessons.

Accessible, Comprehensive, Continuous, Experiential, and Reflective (ACCER) Student Learning Framework of Paranaque City College

Abstract

Background - Paranaque City College (PCC) in the Philippines has no existing Student Learning Framework that will enhance the teaching and learning process and the quality of student learning. This study discusses about the significance of the Student Learning Framework called ACCER or Accessible, Comprehensive, Continuous, Experiential and Reflective.

Purpose - ACCER is an acronym for Accessible, Comprehensive, Continuous, Experiential and Reflective Student Learning Framework. This study was conducted to determine the current status of the quality of teaching and learning at Paranaque City College. Specifically, it aimed to: (1) determine the demographic profiles of both educators and students in terms of age, gender, employment status/year level, length of service/student status; (2) find out the level of assessment in the current learning framework in PCC as perceived both by educators and students in terms of the following descriptions: a. accessible b. comprehensive c. continuous d. experiential e. reflective.

Design/methodology/approach - This study utilized the quantitative method of research. Researchers use mathematical frameworks and ideas that relate to the amount under consideration in this technique of inquiry. Objective, detailed, and in many cases investigative, quantitative research frameworks are characteristics of the discipline. This style of investigation yields logical, statistical, and unbiased results. Structured data collection was carried out utilizing samples that represent the 10% of the population. There were 187 student participants and 30 faculty members in this quantitative investigation.

Findings - The ACCER Student Learning Framework's criteria, such as level of agreeableness, were found to be helpful in determining the current status of educators and students. Educators may find that students' self-reflection is at its maximum point when using a holistic approach. Faculty members, on the other hand, must work together to improve their methods of teaching. According to the findings of the study, educators must update their teaching materials to make resources more readily available. ACCER Student Learning Framework, developed by PCC's current President/College Administrator, has crucial indicators that can help all of PCC's faculty members think more deeply on their teaching methods.

Research limitations - *This study is limited only to the student learning framework to improve the teaching and learning process at Paranaque City College.*

Originality/value - The Student Learning Framework was originally developed by the main author and its uniqueness will improve the teaching and learning process and student performance of Paranaque City College students.

Challenges of Motorcycle Parts, Accessories, and Repair Services Business Amidst Pandemic

Abstract

Background - The motorcycle industry has a global impact in the Philippine economy. Motorcycle parts, accessories, and repair services becomes in demand also. The pandemic crisis affected all economic sectors including the motorcycle industry, many problems have been facing and coping up and with these are still a big challenge on how to survive.

Purpose - This study aims to know the problems of the motorcycle parts, accessories, and repair services business in the municipality of Santa Maria, province of Bulacan, Philippines and how they cope up with the challenges leading them to be still in the business.

Design/methodology/approach - The study used a phenomenological qualitative research method. Phenomenology is an approach to qualitative research that focuses on the commonality of a lived experience within a particular group. Interviews, observation, and documentation are the techniques used in gathering data. The researcher used guided questionnaires to analyse the motorcycle parts, accessories, and services business. The respondents are the owners of the business.

Findings - The motorcycle shop business is now facing a great challenge especially in terms of financial stability. The pandemic Covid-19 has caused a lot of troubles in their operation, inventories, workforce and customer retention. All participants suffered a decrease in sales due to loss of jobs of their customers. Prioritizing on the primary needs of the families rather than expending their savings in motorcycle expenditures. The motorcycle industry as a whole is growing even the time of pandemic, more industries have innovated and continue developing technological advancement in motorcycle technology. We recommend that business owners should continue in their business operation, focusing more on customer satisfaction and retention, prioritize the inventories which are primary needs of the motorcycle. Develop new concept in marketing strategies and practices, make use of social media as a medium of promotion and advertising, introduce an on call system or home service. Continue to train workforce, be friendly with the customers and develop a positive outlook on the business.

Research limitations - The informants of the study is limited only to five due to restrictions in the business operations during pandemic. Future researchers can add more informants.

Originality/value - This study is a very rare study conducted in the municipality of Santa Maria even pre-pandemic and during pandemic.
